


Message from the Director General

2017 has been another year of considerable fluidity and high unpredictability for global and European affairs and of substantial instability in Greece's extended neighborhood. Our research focused on several areas, including Greece's role in a changing EU (and NATO), the huge migration challenge for both Greece and Europe, Greece's foreign policy, with an emphasis on Turkey and its northern neighbors (in the latter there is some mobility in conflict resolution efforts), European integration and religious freedom. In this context, we continued to be quite active in the context of various networks, such as EuroMeSCo and the Mercator European Dialogue and projects, such as FEUTURE and New Pact for Europe.

ELIAMEP received an Academy of Athens Award for the publication of its White Book on Greek Foreign Policy, Defence and Security but also for its overall contribution to the Greek and European public dialogue on foreign and European affairs. That honor convinced us that we need to focus more on strategic policy recommendations. Hence two documents are in preparation: an English language updated and revised edition of the White Book and the Greece 2021 National Strategy.

2018, our 30th anniversary, will find us older and wiser. It will be a good time for re-thinking and re-assessing our objectives and research methods and priorities. We are planning a number of initiatives, such as a large EU Simulation exercise for high school students from all over Greece and various conferences. We will be submitting several applications for projects, including a major proposal in the area of conflict prevention, management and resolution, where ELIAMEP has a long tradition and considerable experience, with its Halki International Seminars and the USIP training seminars. Finally, we will be completing our digital infrastructure upgrade and the re-construction of our offices, which will provide us with a larger, state of the art, multi-purpose meeting room. And, as always, we will be trying to identify and attract promising young scholars.

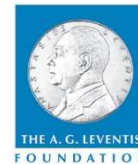
Professor Loukas Tsoukalis said after the ceremony:

During 2017, Grassrootsmobilise's fourth and penultimate year, the team's focus was on drawing all fieldwork to a close, filling any remaining gaps in the data required for our analyses on the individual country cases, across the four cases, and within certain preselected themes, and moving into the main phase of dissemination of our research results. Effie Fokas also began a second round of interviews in the context of her research on 'grasstops mobilizations'.

Crisis-Equity Democracy for Europe and Latin America (CRISEULA)

The objective of the project is the comparative analysis of crisis and crisis management alongside with its social and democratic implications, in Europe and Latin America.

-  Increase the public awareness on regional and bi-regional issues contributing to create peer pressures for regional and bi-regional cooperation.

Towards a Citizens' Union (2CU)

The project is geared towards enhancing the knowledge and debate about the European integration project and the role of citizens. Within and beyond a network of renowned policy institutes specialising in EU affairs, the partners intend to enhance (i) participatory and (ii) representative democracy and (iii) accountability in the EU, and thereby strive "Towards a Citizens' Union" (2CU).

2CU fosters the dialogue between the academic world and policy-makers and to build bridges between different communities. The defined target group captures a wide cross-section of interlocutors, e.g. other think tankers, academics, politicians, national and EU-level policy-makers, representatives of civil society organisations (CSOs), and journalists.

From research to policy through raising awareness of the state of the art on social media and convergence (COMPACT)

COMPACT seeks to increase awareness on the state of the art in terms of research on social media and convergence, regulatory approaches concerning social media, and related pre-standardisation and coordination activities. The project started in October 2017 with the main purpose to stimulate debate among key stakeholders and diffuse best practices and innovative ideas. At the kick-off meeting of the project, which took place in Brussels on 7-8 December 2017, project partners had the opportunity to discuss and clarify the project's work plan, its activities and dissemination strategy. Besides work on the project's branding, management scheme and interaction with other media-related projects which are funded by the EU, the first months of the project were devoted to planning, designing and starting research on three key project reports: a) a report on the state of the art on research on social media and convergence; b) a report on current policies and regulatory frameworks concerning media and convergence; and c) a report on national courts, social media and convergence.

Taking a Reflexive approach to Gender Equality for institutional Transformation (TARGET)

TARGET aims to initiate institutional change in seven gender equality innovating institutions (GEIIs) in the Mediterranean basin – including research performing organisations (RPOs), research funding organisations (RFOs) and a network of universities. TARGET takes a reflexive approach which goes beyond the formal adoption of a gender equality plan by emphasizing an iterative reflection of progress made as well as establishing a community of practice to effect institutional transformation. Actual change is the result of increased institutional willingness and capacity to identify, reflect on and address gender bias in a sustained way. ELIAMEP's role in the TARGET project: As an established research and policy institute in Greece and in Europe, ELIAMEP is a partner among the consortium organisations that have committed to formulating and adopting a Gender Equality Plan (GEP) – the first research and innovation organisation in Greece to do so. While it is a relatively small organisational entity (in terms of scientific and administrative staff), ELIAMEP is the center of a larger research community that includes a wide network of its researchers who are also affiliated with different Greek universities, links with many researchers and funding organizations in Greece and abroad, and a large number of trainees and external collaborators. ELIAMEP is the consortium partner responsible for developing policy recommendations for promoting gender equality in research and innovation institutions. To ensure that action taken has a multiplier effect, ELIAMEP will also undertake targeted dissemination activities to initiate a national/regional discourse on gender equality in Research & Innovation.

Enhancing the Integration of Women, Beneficiaries of International Protection by Development and Implementation of Multifaceted Integration Trainings (INTEGRA-TRAIN)

In the context of increasing refugee inflows in the European continent it becomes highly relevant to implement practical actions responding to existing gaps in migrant/refugee integration across the EU member states. This project aims to strengthen the integration of women beneficiaries of international protection via the development and implementation of integration training. This aim will be achieved by way of transferring knowledge and experience from member states with longer experience in refugee integration (Spain and Italy) to countries with weaker and less developed integration structures (Bulgaria, Greece and Malta) which are entry points for newcomer refugees and migrants. In view of the unforeseen high numbers of incoming migrants and asylum seekers in Europe the conduct of context-specific orientation courses to facilitate familiarization with the new social, legal, political and cultural environment of member states becomes crucial for fostering the overall integration process that takes course in the longer run.

Evaluation of the Common European Asylum System under Pressure and Recommendations for Further Development (CEASEVAL)



The issue of migration and the development of the Common European Asylum System (CEAS) are key issues of interest in the European Union, especially since the outbreak of the refugee crisis in 2015. The European Union has embarked on a process of reforming its migration policy through the 2015 European Agenda on Migration and revising the CEAS, which, failed to adequately respond to the 'stress' of the refugee crisis has brought to the fore the vulnerabilities and inadequacies of the System rendering, therefore, imperative the need for its revision.

The CEASEVAL project seeks to explore the current system and trace the harmonization process across the Member States as well as to evaluate its successful and/or unsuccessful implementation. The main goal of the research project is to submit policy recommendations for the revision of the Common European Asylum System (CEAS).

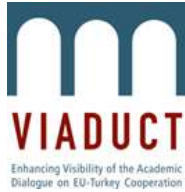

Enhancing Visibility of the Academic Dialogue on EU-Turkey Cooperation (VIADUCT)

In the first six months of 2015 more than 100,000 migrants crossed the Mediterranean. The historical complexity and volatility of EU-Turkey relations are reflected by research and teaching in this field. There are international research projects as well as many smaller and nationally funded studies and projects dealing with Turkey, including its relationship with the EU. Linking these different projects, diffusing knowledge on the European Integration process and exploiting synergies between international players constitutes real added-value for European Integration studies. The Future of EU-Turkey Relations: Mapping Dynamics and Testing Scenarios (FEUTURE)




The EU and Turkey face mounting challenges both in relation to one another and internationally. The EU has recently been confronted with a series of crises predominant of which are the financial and migration crisis. These developments as well as the Brexit-question are likely to make differentiation a growing phenomenon. On the other hand, Turkey faces polarisation between different political forces, the state and civil society. The neighbourhood is unravelling to the East and South and a power shift is under way at global level. This places EU-Turkey relations in a fundamentally new context. Against this backdrop, FEUTURE's research aims to: map the dynamics of EU-Turkey relations as to underlying narratives and thematic drivers; substantiate most-likely future scenario(s) and assess its implications; draw policy recommendations.

FEUTURE provides excellence and pursues an ambitious, inspiring and innovative programme in a three-phased structure of elaboration, exploration and extrapolation. It applies an inter-temporal, interdisciplinary and international approach by analysing drivers within six thematic dimensions (politics, security, economics, energy, migration, identity) and across four levels of analysis (EU, Turkey, neighbourhood, global). FEUTURE integrates new knowledge and tests the implications of 3 ideal-type future scenarios for EU-Turkey relations: conflict, cooperation and convergence. ELIAMEP acts as a partner in the implementation of FEUTURE project.

FYROM and South East Europe

The project aims to foster dialogue and cooperation between Greece and the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia.

The formation of the new government in Skopje, led by Zoran Zaev, in May 2017, has set in motion a series of important developments in the relations between FYROM and Bulgaria. ELIAMEP Briefing Note examines the recent rapprochement between the two countries centered around the Treaty of Friendship, Good Neighborhood and Cooperation, signed in 1 August 2017

-  New politics by the new FYROM government?

In his Working Paper Ambassador (retired) Alexandros Mallias analyses the perspectives for improving the relations between Greece and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia the day after the formation of a new Government in Skopje. Alexandros Mallias, who was first Head of Mission of Greece to Skopje, 1995-1999, suggests that the two governments should not raise high expectations. They should work to enhance and expand the Confidence Building Measures' Process and rather opt for a quiet diplomacy on the name issue He stresses that FYROM's 1991 Constitution is a bad one, being the root cause of problems with its neighbors as well as of the endemic interethnic conflict. It was already amended 30 (thirty) times within 15 years. He is of the opinion that there are still some extra miles to go.



FYROM and Greece: Confidence Building Measures- view from civil-society

The name dispute between FYROM and Greece has deeply affected almost all segments of academic/scientific cooperation and generally civil society interaction. As a result, the civil societies of the two countries have not managed to date to build strong channels of unofficial communication and collaboration that would be instrumental in helping official diplomatic channels between the two countries. At the same time, the two countries have as of recent initiated a process of Confidence Building Measures (CBMs) with the hope that cooperation in 'low politics' and among civil society actors will strengthen the otherwise weak and problematic bilateral relations. In this context, the main purpose of the proposed project will be to contribute to enhancing relations between Athens and Skopje by investigating and assessing areas of existing cooperation, providing 'lessons learned' from it as well as proposing ways through which civil society collaboration could be strengthened in the future.

This report is the output of the project focusing on relations between Greece and FYROM, funded by the Ministry for Foreign Affairs of Sweden, and implemented by Analytika (Skopje) and ELIAMEP. The two teams from Athens/Thessaloniki and Skopje had a joint planning and methods workshop. During that workshop the scope of the investigation was agreed upon, the data to be collected and the method of analysis were initially discussed and the preliminary list of projects to be studied was made. After this planning workshop, however, each side was alone in deciding the details of the data collection and analysis and in conducting the actual analysis itself. The partners did not also have the opportunity to discuss project results.

Europe Direct ELIAMEP

Europe Direct Information Centre at ELIAMEP belongs to a pan-European network of Information Centres set-up and co-financed by the European Commission. Its purpose is to bring the European union closer to its citizens by providing them with multifaceted and comprehensive information on any European issue and by raising awareness on EU-related matters at the local and national level.

Project Duration: 2013- 2018

Funding Agency: European Commission

Europe Direct ELIAMEP directs citizens that contact the centre about a European issue, to the appropriate sources of information and competent authorities at a national and European level. It also organises information activities and campaigns on European issues (Workshops, Seminars, Lectures, Conferences etc).

During 2017, Europe Direct ELIAMEP organized 5 events for more than 400 students and teachers of primary and secondary education and 4 conferences attended by over 400 persons. It also actively participated in 6 events organised by third parties in Greece and abroad.

The Centre researched and answered almost 100 questions submitted by citizens to its helpdesk. It published more than 820 new posts on its official website, which received over 20,000 visits throughout the year. In 2017 it has strengthened its image in the social media by having 3.197 likes on Facebook, 476 followers on Twitter and 224 followers on Instagram.

Architectural replicas in the scramble for the past: Politics of identity in Istanbul, Athens, Skopje (REPLICIAS)

In Southeastern Europe, architectural heritage has often been recruited to the service of politics. Shared layers of history (for example the Hellenistic, Roman and Ottoman eras among others) have been split among competing historiographies and, in a period marked by crisis, rising nationalism and 'East-West' dilemmas, remain in the core of heated debates. Anchored on on-going projects in three cities in the region, this research explores the ways heritage is claimed through its physical reproduction, a topic barely researched until now.

Replicas of all sizes – ranging from the urban scale down to the artefact – get involved in political and economic agendas and often ignite reactions from various social, political and national groups inside and outside the countries where they are located. In some cases this corresponds to a recurring wave of revivalism, resulting to large replica buildings installed in the heart of the city, such as in Istanbul (where the reconstruction of the barracks on Taksim square led to the Gezi riots in 2013) or in Skopje ('Skopje 2014' project). In other occasions the production of copies is politicised on a smaller scale, such as in the case of the copy of "Alexander's Sarcophagus" at the Skopje Archaeological Museum or the copies of the missing Parthenon Sculptures at the New Acropolis Museum.

Research Programmes



Crisis Observatory (Το Παρατηρητήριο για την Κρίση - Dimitris Katsikas, Head)

The Crisis Observatory is an initiative of the Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP), created in 2013 with the support of the "Stavros Niarchos" Foundation. The Crisis Observatory provides information and analysis of the problems that led to the crisis in Greece, as well as the crisis management policies, and their consequences until today, presented in a format that is simple, comprehensible and appealing to the general public.

During five years of operation, the Observatory has received considerable recognition from both the research community and the wider public. The Observatory has an active presence in the social media, seeking to approach the younger generation in particular, through the organisation of public events and especially its Annual Conference, attracting a large number of young people.

In 2017 the Observatory continued its multifaceted activities' programme, with a special emphasis on new research. In 2017, the Observatory was awarded two new research programmes and assumed the responsibility for the operation of a new Research Chair at ELIAMEP. More specifically, since May 2017, the Crisis Observatory participates in the bi-regional research programme Jean Monnet Network "Crisis-Equity-Democracy for Europe and Latin America", whose aim is the comparative study of crisis and crisis management in Europe and Latin America. Moreover, the Crisis Observatory was assigned a new research project by the Bank of Greece, on the 'Fiscal Policy in the European Union'. The project was launched in June 2017 and the research phase was concluded in December 2017. Finally, the Observatory runs the 'A. G. Leventis Foundation Research Chair', a new research programme focusing on European political economy issues of Greek interest. The Chair is funded by the A.G. Leventis Foundation and has been in operation since October 2017. As part of the Chair's activities a research project entitled "Reforms in Public Administration during the crisis: Review, Description, Evaluation" is carried out for the period 2017-18. In the events programme, the Observatory organized a discussion on "Economic Recovery after Depression: Historical and International Experience". The event was held in February at the offices of the Representation of the European Commission in Greece and featured as main speaker Dr. Andres Solimano, founder and president of the International Center for Globalisation and Development. On the publications front, 2017 saw the Observatory's first book publication. In September the book "Understanding the Greek Crisis: Answers to Key Questions about the State, the Economy and Europe" (in Greek), edited by Dimitris Katsikas, Kyriakos Filinis and Marianthi Anastasatou, was published by Papazisis publications. The book is the culmination of an initiative that originally started in 2014, with an online series of texts on key questions about the Greek crisis, which was materialized with the cooperation of Huffington Post in Greece. The book includes longer, updated and re-worked versions of the originals texts, as well as completely new texts from recognized academics and researchers.

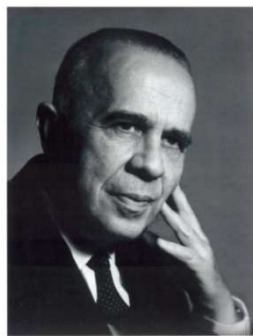

In the context of ELIAMEP's South-East Europe Programme, Dr Ioannis Armakolas, Stavros Costopoulos Fellow for the academic year 2016-2017, led or coordinated research on a number of projects.

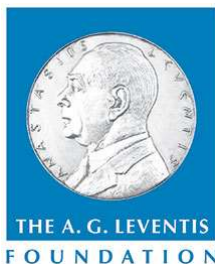
The projects covered the following topics: a) Investigating social attitudes between Greece and FYROM, b) Evaluating cross-border cooperation between Greece and FYROM in the fields of EU projects and higher education, c) Addressing negative stereotypes in the Southern Balkans.

Dr. Ioannis Armakolas also organised a number of public and closed events in Athens, Thessaloniki and Sofia. A major conference Two-day tribute to the "Unknown Balkans" was organized in Athens in July 2017. Attendees were able to discuss with more than 25 speakers (academics, diplomats, journalists and politicians) coming from EU and Western Balkans, on issues related to the region of Southeast Europe, with particular emphasis on Kosovo, FYROM and Bosnia and Herzegovina. Besides the conference panels, there were two short films and photo exhibitions as well, with pictures from the 3 countries. Moreover, Dr. Armakolas was a key member of the organization committee of a conference co-organised by the British Foreign and Commonwealth Office, ELIAMEP and Oxford University in Thessaloniki. The conference focused the current state of political and security affairs in the Western Balkans. Also, was among the co-organisers on a closed workshop on the Western Balkans, organized

in Sofia and co-hosted by Friedrich Ebert Stiftung and ELIAMEP. Dr. Ioannis Armakolas co-hosted or co-organised a number of public activities for the presentation of research project findings, launch of new reports and other opportunities. This included the presentation of one report on the opinion poll findings on the name issue and on cross-border cooperation between Greece and FYROM. ELIAMEP also organized a public event and talk by EU Commissioner for Neighbourhood Policy and Accession Negotiations (NEAR) Johannes Hahn.

Overall, over the period in question, Dr. Ioannis Armakolas presented at conferences and workshops in more than 15 events in Athens, Thessaloniki, Brussels, Berlin-Brandenburg, Ljubljana, Krakow, Sofia, Pristina on various aspects of Greek foreign policy and the politics and security of the Western Balkans. With regards to the journal 'Southeast European and Black Sea Studies', Ioannis Armakolas continued to run all academic and administrative affairs of the journal and to coordinate the editorial process.

A. G. Leventis Foundation Research Chair (2017 -)



The 'A. G. Leventis Foundation Research Chair' is a new research programme focusing on European political economy issues of Greek interest. The Chair is funded by the A.G. Leventis Foundation and has been in operation since October 2017. As part of the Chair's activities a research project entitled "Reforms in Public Administration during the crisis: Review, Description, Evaluation" is carried out for the period 2017-2018.

The objective of the project is to document the "horizontal" reforms in Public Administration as requested in the three Greek Economic Adjustment Programmes, the juxtaposition with the relevant reforms implemented in the Greek legislation and their evaluation. More specifically the programme objectives are:

- ✚ The assessment of the implementation of the reforms.
- ✚ Evaluation of the reforms' impact.
- ✚ Overall evaluation of the progress made in the functioning of the public administration and identification and analysis of the obstacles encountered

The project is coordinated by Professor Calliope Spanou, of the Department of Political Science and Public Administration of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens. Vangelis Arvanitis, PhD candidate in the Department of Economic Science of the University of Thessaly supports the activities of the Research Chair, while Dimitris Katsikas, Head of Crisis Observatory coordinates the programme.

[Journal of Southeast European and Black Sea Studies](#)

Southeast European and Black Sea Studies is the official journal of ELIAMEP and is currently in its sixteenth year of publication. It is published four times a year by Taylor & Francis Group (Routledge Journals, London), and has consistently been a central academic point of reference for the Black Sea region as well as Southeast Europe.



The aim of the journal is to establish a line of dialogue with the Balkan and Black Sea regions, which until recently remained isolated from the European mainstream. The regions are still in need of serious comparative study, as are the individual countries, no longer 'at the edge' of Europe but increasingly significant players in their own right.

The principal disciplines covered by the journal are politics, political economy, international relations and modern history; other disciplinary approaches are accepted as appropriate. The journal takes both an academic and also a more practical, policy-oriented approach and hopes to compensate for the serious information deficit on the countries under consideration. It provides a unique opportunity to establish a new paradigm of analysis for the region, one that attempts to break away from the traditional ethnocentric approaches to develop a deeper and more fruitful understanding of the area.

Over the last year, the journal published a number of very insightful papers as well as high impact special issues that greatly contributed to our understanding of European politics and EU enlargement in the Western Balkans and complex political, economic, social and security developments in Southeast Europe and the Black Sea area, including Greece, Cyprus, Turkey, Russia and Ukraine. The journal published articles analyzing many crucial current problems and challenges for these regions. The journal also published very timely special issues: on the state of Turkish democracy and also on EU enlargement in the Western Balkans.

Throughout the year, the journal continued to publish high quality original work on a number of themes relevant to the Southeast Europe region, and both views and citations of the articles continue to increase.

All articles published in *SEEBSS* undergo a rigorous peer-reviewer process, and the journal has been included in the ISI Social Science Citation Index since 2007.

Bledi FETA, Junior Research Fellow

In 2017, Bledar Feta continued his ongoing activity as an active member of the South East Europe Program of ELIAMEP. The analytical spectrum of his research included the monitoring and analysis of the political developments in Albania, Kosovo, and the Albanian inhabited areas of the Western Balkans. Through the daily scanning of the Albanian and Kosovar media he investigated the current state of play in the EU accession process of both countries in an effort to identify the political, social and economic problems that slow down their accession process to the EU.

Bledar became involved in the program's research project "Addressing the Problem of Negative National Stereotypes in the Southern Balkans" funded by the Kosovo Foundation for Open Society. In the context of this research project Bledar dealt with the investigation of the political situation in Kosovo and he produced a working paper. In Working Paper 88/2017 Bledar analyzed the main aspects of the political and institutional crisis that hit Kosovo after 2014 Parliamentary elections.

On the occasion of the snap parliamentary elections in FYROM Bledar wrote a briefing note where he analyzed FYROM's two-year political stalemate, arguing over the importance of the elections as an opportunity for the formation of a stable government.

During the same year, Bledar participated in the "Act for Free Movement" transnational training programme organized by the European Alternatives, a Berlin-based organization. Under this project, Bledar travelled to Warsaw, Madrid and London where he attended a number of training seminars on the defense of the free movement of people in the EU. Bledar was also one of the members of the working team responsible for the organization of the two-day conference regarding the "Unknown Balkans" which took place in June. As a background work Bledar has been collecting material in order to allow the program's team to remain up to date with regional developments and properly assess their significance.

Head of Crisis Observatory

Dr. Katsikas coordinated and supervised the operation of the Crisis Observatory during 2017.

Dr. Katsikas was the coordinator and scientific supervisor of the research programme, commissioned by the Bank of Greece, entitled "The Political Economy of Reforms in Greece (2010-2014)". The research phase of the programme was concluded in 2016. In early 2017 Dr. Katsikas and the team of researchers presented at the Bank of Greece the findings of the research, while the final report of the programme was submitted in the summer of 2017 and is expected to be published as a book by the Bank of Greece in early 2018.

Moreover, in May 2017, ELIAMEP signed its participation in a new three-year research programme entitled "Crisis Management, Equity, Democracy", under the auspices of Jean Monnet Networks; the Crisis Observatory/ ELIAMEP is part of the consortium of participating institutions and Dr. Katsikas participates as country coordinator and researcher for Greece. As part of his duties Dr. Katsikas participated in the kick-off event of the programme in Brussels in June 2017 and in the first of a series of conferences and coordination events, that took place in Sao Paolo, Brazil in October 2017.

Between September and December 2017, Dr. Katsikas participated as a researcher in a research programme assigned to the Crisis Observatory by the Bank of Greece on "Fiscal Policy in the European Union".
